#### **Program / Project Description:**

The project involves the purchase of playground equipment and creating a play space where children who are unable to climb can play with their peers. The equipment will be placed on a rubber surface, enabling wheelchair access, and feature ground level items. Vision and/or hearing impaired children will have access to sound and vibration play items. There will be features, such as ladders and slides, to challenge children with typical abilities.

Play is an important part of a child's development. It helps develop social, physical and problem solving skills. However, children with disabilities often lack places to play. This is especially true in the Southside of San Antonio; an area declared to be a very low opportunity area for children (according to DiversityDataKids.org.) Furthermore, we are in an area identified by the federal government as economically depressed (Eastside Promise Zone).

LONELINESS. Social isolation can be more painful to live with than the physical or development disabilities themselves. Many kids with disabilities spent less than two hours a week with their peers outside of classroom. A study by the Odette School of Business at the University of Windsor, shows that 53% of disabled kids have no friends.

EVERYONE BENEFITS. Inclusive playgrounds allow children of different ability levels to play together. They can inspire mutual understanding, friendships, and a real sense of community. Children who learn to play with children of all ability levels will be more prepared for a diverse work environment. An inclusive playground shows that everyone has value.

This will be the only inclusive playground in our area. It will serve our Early Learning Center, Elementary school, the seven churches that meet on our campus and will be open to the community.

#### **Evaluation Plan:**

We will monitor use among children with disabilities in terms of number of children with disabilities, number of families, and hours of use to evaluate success and make adjustments

#### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Ongoing maintenance is already a regular budget item. The requested funds are for new equipment and installation.
