Program / Project Description:

MDA Texas respectfully requests a grant to support MDA Summer Camp. Each child that participates in MDA Summer Camp lives with a neuromuscular disease and all campers face similar physical and emotional obstacles. In this camp community where no one is different and support is strong, insecurities quickly evaporate, defense mechanisms crumble, solitude is broken, and fun is had by all. Through these new friendships, together with this environment that emphasizes ability rather than disability, confidence is built that will endure beyond the camp experience and provide a source of strength for a lifetime.

This grant will benefit MDA Texas and our in-person summer camp and recreation programming at Camp For All in Burton, Camp John Marc in Meridian, Camp Aranzazu in Rockport, and a virtual option providing a way for all campers to stay safe and connected, have fun together, and continue to enjoy the magic of camp. In Bexar County 40 children ages 8-17 are registered with MDA. All will be invited to participate at no cost to their families.

Evaluation Plan:

Post-camp evaluations are offered to campers and their families to measure behavioral, emotional and self-image changes that result from MDA Summer Camp. Results of these evaluations guide local camp program enhancements and adjustments year to year. At the conclusion of each camp season, each camp location reports data, including total number of campers, volunteers, and medical staff, and details any incidents that occurred during the camp session. MDA Camp Directors also speak with families to gather feedback and suggestions for improvement.

Evaluations qualitatively measure camper satisfaction, resonance and relevance of camp activities and curriculum, and influence of camp on children's independence and ability to ask for help. Staff, counselor, and medical team observations bolster the evaluation process with qualitative measures, supplemented by camper testimony. MDA issues an annual, public Summer Camp Impact report posted on mda.org. Evaluation results consistently guide camp program enhancements and adjustments, including adjustments to campground partnerships, staff/counselor roles and training, camp curricula, and program marketing.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

MDA Summer Camp would not be possible without the generous support of our sponsors and supporters. Funding earmarked for camp will continue to be used to support the program and to ensure campers are able to attend at no cost to families. Funding for summer camp also funds future recreation and camp programs, as expenses occur all throughout the year and are needed in advance to secure future locations.

MDA is engaged in year-round efforts to fund summer camp, as well as other programs that support children, adults, and families. MDA raises funds through direct marketing, consumer/community engagement programs, distinguished events, fundraising events, corporate partnerships, foundation grants, and planned and major giving.
